The Mahomet Area Youth Club is a program committed to empowering youth through enriching and educational experiences that promote personal growth, leadership and community involvement. They provide a safe, supportive and engaging environment for young people and provide a diverse range of programs and activities, designed to inspire and equip the youth of the Mahomet area to reach their full potential and contribute positively to their community. MAYC also offers a flagship program, entitled the After the Bell Afterschool Program, designed to support students beyond regular school hours. This program offers a structured, supervised environment where children can participate in a range of enriching activities after school. The curriculum includes homework assistance, educational enrichment, arts and crafts, physical activities and social skill development. MAYC also offers programming for summer camps and school breaks. ### **Mahomet Township General Assistance**

Mahomet Township maintains their own roads/taxing body and is a separate entity from Village. General Assistance (GA) is a temporary support program for eligible residents of Mahomet Township who are facing urgent needs such as eviction, utility shutoff, food insecurity, or other emergencies. The program provides financial help for up to 30 days and is considered a last resort. All other available options must be explored prior to applying for General Assistance. ("This includes Illinois Public Aid, support from family or friends, personal loans, or assistance from other social service agencies. If you are eligible for Illinois Public Aid, you are not eligible for General Assistance.") The Township Office is located at 512 E. ### **Mom's Pantry**

Where— **Mom's Pantry**, 302 W. State St. (behind MSHS, adjacent to football field)

What—Clothing, toiletries, non-perishable goods—Popular product needs include: Canned pasta (i.e. ravioli, Spaghetti-o's), peanut butter (both crunchy and smooth), jelly, pasta noodles and sauces, tuna, canned chicken, hamburger and tuna helper, breakfast items (cereal, pancake mix, syrup, breakfast bars, Pop Tarts), individual snacks, soups (aside of tomato or chicken noodle), refrigerated donations — including meat, milk, eggs, butter, and cheese slices — as storage space is available, and toilet paper and hygiene products (toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, body wash). **Summer Lunches Program**

The Summer Lunches Program is able to offer assistance during the summer months and is organized and executed through community church efforts, with generous donations from Mahomet Lions Club and Domino's Pizza. Meals are organized and donated Monday through Friday, throughout the summer. The program began its initiative on the Candlewood Estates property, but residents do not need to live in the Candlewood community. If someone needs a meal, they may come and receive a meal.
