Mahomet Lodge #220 is one of over 400 Masonic lodges in Illinois and is a non-profit fraternal organization comprised of adult men who share a common goal of developing positive relationships between the members and their families, as well as in the community at large and is steeped in tradition. They provide scholarships to local students in Mahomet-Seymour and Fisher High Schools and host an annual Community Builder Award every spring, too. They also participate in a variety of local events, including the Illinois Marathon, Mahomet Soda Fest, the Seymour July 4th parade, the Mahomet Auto Fest, the MAYC half-marathon, Trunk or Treat and Village Christmas. Several of their annual

fundraisers that have become mainstays in the Mahomet community, including the annual Egg My Yard Easter fundraiser, the Auto Fest silent auction, the Mahomet 220 Golf Outing and the Christmas Photo Mini-Sessions. The organization is funded by dues paid by the members and a variety of fund-raising events held every year. Mom's Pantry provides food, toiletries, school supplies and clothing, free of charge, to any family with a student currently enrolled in the M-S school district. Cindy also facilitates many student groups (Scouts, athletic teams, etc.) by organizing a day (or several) to help with Mom's Pantry needs. Mom's Pantry is supported solely by donations.
